The intent of these scholarships and placement is to support these professionals in exploring avenues of optometry which may be inside or outside their scope of practice. This is to enable them to become better practitioners, to advance their careers.

Whilst YO NSW/ACT do encourage applicants to consider applying in areas of practice that may be possibly outside their comfort zone, please be aware that we expect recipients to be able to implement this new knowledge into practice.

Applications will open on January 15th 2018 and close on April 30th 2018.

Terms and Conditions

Purpose	This policy provides a framework for establishing and managing Young Optometrists NSW/ACT (YO NSW/ACT) scholarships and placement.	
Scope	This policy applies to: All scholarships and placements awarded by YO NSW/ACT.	
Value	There will be three scholarships and one placement offered annually, with the total value up to \$7,000.	
Establishment of Scholarships	The purpose of the YO NSW/ACT Scholarships and Placement Program is to allow members, who will be among the most able in their profession, to explore avenues for continued education within, or outside, their current scope of practice so that they can become better practitioners.	
	The scholarship program provides three merit-based scholarships which may be partial or the full price of a professional development event.	
	The placement program will allow an optometrist to visit, sit in and observe an optometric practice in another state.	
	There will be a formal process comprising of a written expression of interest (submitted online) for determining the eligibility, range and value of all scholarships and placements, which will be decided by the YO executive committee and its affiliates.	
Eligibility Criteria	Only Young Optometrists NSW/ACT members, who are not part of the executive committee, may apply. As well as this, they must be registered and practicing optometrists delivering clinical services in NSW/ACT, who are within 10 years of graduation.	
	For the purposes of this scholarship, applicants must be delivering clinical services involving direct patient interaction, providing treatment, intervention, assistance, assessment, management and education across the healthcare system.	
Terms and Conditions	 The travel placement and scholarship must be used within the calendar year. Payment will be made in the form of a reimbursement. Successful recipients must pay for all associated costs and YO NSW/ACT will reimburse the amount back accordingly; dependent on the scholarship tier, or allocated placement amount. If the successful recipient incurs costs greater than that of the scholarship or placement amount, they are personally responsible for the excess. Successful recipients must provide all appropriate documentation, including evidence of travel arrangements and provision of receipts as proof the money awarded was used appropriately. YO NSW/ACT may request further information from applicants and reserves the right to contact organisations cited in the application to 	

- verify information.
- 5. Generally recipients may only receive one scholarship or placement grant once within a three year timeframe. This is subject to change only with the approval of committee members and its affiliates.
- 6. Successful recipients are required to provide a written report to YO NSW/ACT within 6 weeks of returning from their travel, detailing the professional elements of the travel experience. YO NSW/ACT will be granted full permission to share this through their social media avenues and they may be required to share their experience publicly at YO NSW/ACT events.
- 7. In the event that the proposed travel is cancelled or postponed, the recipient must immediately inform the YO NSW/ACT in writing. If the proposed travel is cancelled and the scholarship or placement fund has already been paid, the recipient may use the fund towards the next event of the same description. If the next conference is not within the same year, they must reimburse YO NSW/ACT the full amount to hold onto until the year of the event. For example, if the recipient was awarded a Tier One scholarship for a Orthokeratology Society of Oceania (OSO) Conference but could not attend in 2018, they may use the funds towards the next OSO Conference, but YO NSW/ACT will hold onto the funds until 2020 (they year of the next conference).
- 8. Applicants shall be responsible for paying any taxes incurred or arising from the receipt of the scholarship or placement fund. Applicants are encouraged to seek advice from the Australian Taxation Office and/or their accountant regarding possible tax implications arising from the scholarship or placement fund.

Value of scholarships

The scholarship is to be used towards a short course, workshop or conference for which continuing professional development hours can be accrued. YO NSW/ACT will not be responsible for lodging continuing professional development points. This onus is on the recipient.

Maximum funding total available is \$7,000. There will be three tiers of scholarships:

1. Tier One

Value up to \$750 for a conference within Australia. This scholarship is aimed to provide insight into different scopes of practice, for example Australian College of Behavioural Optometry's National Vision Conference (NACBO), or Orthokeratology Society of Oceania (OSO).

2. Tier Two

Value up to \$2000 for a workshop/conference anywhere around the world. This scholarship is aimed at optometrists who wish to delve further into their scope of practice. This option is ideal for applicants who already have specialty specific equipment in their practice, or will be looking to purchase this in the future. Examples include conferences held by Orthokeratology Society of Oceania and the

	International Cornea & Contact Lens Society of Australia.
	3. Tier Three Value up to \$3000 for a course anywhere around the world. This scholarship is aimed at optometrists who wish to gain hands on experience by pursuing coursework. It is not intended for postgraduate degrees, nor is it a research grant. Examples of such courses include the Optometric Extension Program (OEP) and through The Association for Research in Vision and Ophthalmology (ARVO).
	The placement program allows a recipient to visit an optometric practice, which has a special interest, in another state. The funding is up to the value of \$1250 and will include return flights, accommodation for three nights and meals.
	YO NSW/ACT scholarships may not be used for the procurement of registration to an external organisation or society, such as an annual membership fee. It is up to the recipient to finance their own membership fee if they wish to join that specific society.
Selection Criteria	These are competitive scholarships and placement, and will be awarded on the recommendation of YO NSW/ACT's Committee. Participants will be assessed on the following questions: 1. How will the scholarship or placement program benefit: a) the way you practice optometry? b) your longer term professional goals? c) your patients? 2. Describe your commitment to your scope of practice. 3. Describe your commitment to optometry, as a profession.
Funding	YO NSW/ACT will fund the placement and all scholarships from their annual budget. Scholarship total is subject to annual review and will be decided by YO NSW/ACT Committee.
